NEW QUALITY OF LIFE PIECES WILL HELP RECRUIT TALENT

(St. Joseph, MO) -- At the St. Joseph Chamber of Commerce, the staff and volunteers try to grow St. Joseph's economy by helping local businesses succeed and expand and by helping attract new employers.

An important part of this effort is helping companies attract talented workers. The video, which is just over a minute long, captures St. Joseph's unique quality of life, from its historical architecture to recreational activities.

"St. Joseph really is full of activity," Mr. Lilly said. "So much so that not all of the video that was taken could be kept in the final version because we wanted to keep the viewers' attention in a short time frame. We hope to create more videos in the future to help tell St. Joseph's story."
