The President's Perspective

Don't Mess With St. Joseph!

Perhaps you have traveled to Texas or have seen an ad somewhere, and are aware of the state's popular anti-litter campaign that uses the slogan, "Don't Mess with Texas." The words set a tone that littering in any form is unacceptable and encourages people to take pride in themselves and their state.

A little closer to home, a recent grassroots group calling themselves St. Joseph Sanitation has sprouted and has been embraced at least initially by the City Council. As I understand from reading media reports, they have been formed to research, discuss and provide recommendations to the City Council on what actions should be taken to address the litter, trash, maintenance of property and illegal dumping that has become so common in St. Joseph. This is a big task for a group of residents who, to their credit, have taken it upon themselves to get something done about this critical issue.

I have long advocated for a comprehensive approach for dealing with the appearance of the community. The unsightliness of trash and debris throughout the community should be disappointing to all of us. One might even go far as to say, as residents we should have more pride in our community and ourselves. The truth is the appearance of St. Joseph does not always make a good impression to visitors, residents or those who are considering the community as a place to live or do business.

So, what to do? A few thoughts:

- Litter is a blight. There needs to be a long-term marketing effort to convey that litter is not acceptable. While having volunteers clean up litter feels good and helps improve the appearance that day, we must address a local culture that seems to convey that litter is

acceptable.

- Much of the trash and debris we see around the community is a symptom of a much larger problem; there is no comprehensive system for collecting waste. Today everyone decides individually what they will do to get rid of their trash and some unfortunately choose a solution that imposes their trash on the rest of us. Let's be honest, until trash collection services are provided to every residence and business, we will have problems with trash and debris.

- Improving the appearance of St. Joseph starts at home. Property owners, land lords, renters and home owners must be held accountable for keeping up their property. It seems obvious that what we are doing now is not particularly effective. We must look for innovative solutions that establish reasonable property maintenance standards that can be effectively enforced by the City.

None of this is easy. If it were, it would have already been done. I hope St. Joseph Sanitation has success. They certainly have my support for what they are trying to do and I have pledged the Chamber's assistance in working through the issues. Improving the appearance of St. Joseph will benefit everyone and will demonstrate a sense of pride that this great community deserves. To put it simply, "Don't Mess with St. Joseph!"
