The President's Perspective

New Start, Same Agenda

With January comes a new Congress and Administration along with a new Missouri Legislature. As is often the case with change, there is much hope and anticipation.

In the world of politics, the adage "the more things change, the more things stay the same," often seems to apply. As the new legislative bodies begin their work in $202\,\mathrm{I}$, the needs of business for the most part remain the same.

On the federal agenda, the priorities include continued support for businesses, individuals in need and the economy, as the country works to defeat the COVID-19 virus. Of course, effective vaccine distribution and inoculation will be critical to a recovering economy.

Also, there continues to be the need for a long-overdue federal infrastructure funding package. This includes roads and bridges, but also critical technology infrastructure that upgrades and expands broadband access. I would also offer that I believe it is time in this country to have a serious debate on immigration reform. While this issue is often covered by the media in terms of constructing walls and stopping illegal entry, for business this is a topic related to workforce shortages and talent attraction.

And, on both the federal and state list of legislative priorities

is providing resources to improve the skills of the country's workforce. More jobs are being created that require greater skills and an understanding of new technology. Providing an opportunity for reskilling of those out of work and offering training programs for those entering the job market is critical for business success. This is a priority in St. Joseph given our large manufacturing and production employment base.

In Missouri, the Legislature should pass legislation to address sales tax fairness. The legislation would provide for the collection of sales taxes on online purchases. This would offer a level playing field for our local retail businesses who must compete with online retailers, many of whom are not required to pay sales tax in Missouri.

There are certainly other legislative priorities to consider, but hopefully a fresh start in 2021 and the opportunity to defeat the virus and get back to a more normal life will be the catalyst to address many of the priorities that have been on the business agenda for years. We can only hope!
