Earlier in February, I learned of the passing of John P. Barclay, Jr., past Chairman and CEO of Wire Rope Corporation of America, which at the time was headquartered in St. Joseph. Most of us called him Jack, as he preferred to be called. When I came to St. Joseph in 1990 as City Manager, I had an opportunity to meet Jack. He was a bit of a legend in local business circles and everyone seemed to have a story to tell about interacting with him.

He was tough, opinionated and had a sharp tongue toward those he thought deserved it. He was also smart, articulate and had a good sense of humor. From time to time, he would call and tell me what I and the City were doing wrong and explain what I needed to do to fix the problem. I always enjoyed those calls because Jack would always ask how I was doing and was sincere in his interest that he wanted me and the City to be successful.

Then there was the "Franchise Tax War" in the early 1990s. The City had decided to consider an increase to the franchise tax on utilities that, as you might guess, would cost many of our largest employers a significant amount of money. Jack took exception and mounted a campaign to fight City Hall. Money was raised, attorneys hired, and condemnation of the City's actions was swift. In the end, a treaty was offered with both sides not achieving what they really wanted; thus, it was declared a fair ending to the War. I always felt it was a bit of a bitter pill for Jack to swallow, but it never affected our relationship.


As I approached the end of my sixth year as City Manager, Jack gave me a call one day and asked me to consider becoming President/CEO of the Chamber. He said there was no one else in his mind to consider, plus he felt I knew the community. Did I mention he could be persuasive? Thus, began my new career as a Chamber executive and my unexpected 30-year stay in St. Joseph.
