As I get out and talk to local businesses supporting education continues to be one of the key topics. As many of you know, the Chamber and Mosaic Life Care paid for the consultant for Vision Forward, a community engagement plan to assist the St. Joseph School District in future planning. I wanted to give an update on where we are with Vision Forward.

The following list of priority statements resulted from a series of Vision Forward meetings that took place from January through May 2022. The Community Engagement Team developed the Priority Statements based on public comments and responses shared during the Community Engagement sessions. The Priority Statements have been forwarded to the SJSD leadership as part of the next steps in the process.

District Leadership Solutions, a consulting group with a focus on developing strategic solutions for school districts, will assist the SJSD in developing an Action Plan over the summer.

The community will have an opportunity to review the Action Plan and provide feedback. The anticipated plan will be submitted to the SJSD Board of Education in December 2022.

The Priority Statements to come out of the process are as follows:

- Work toward enhanced pride and improved community commitment to the importance of public education.
- Improve staff recruitment and retention including additional staff support and payment of competitive salaries.
- Expand the availability of quality early childhood education programs citywide.
- Provide a consistent middle school/junior high model both in configuration and curriculum to improve academic achievement.
- Address discipline and low attendance challenges.
- Consolidate, right-size and make more equitable and functional facilities at all levels (elementary, middle school and high school) so that curricula and programs are equivalent, and building operate at optimum efficiency.

I believe that it is our jobs as the local community to own the commitment to quality education. So I ask all of to do your part to support the SISD.
