The President's Perspective

One of the things I hear often is "there are no good jobs in St Joseph." At the end of July, the Missouri Economic Research and Information Center published the Missouri 2021 County Average Wages, which included information that dispels that myth. For "2021 Total Wages for All Industries Private Ownership," out of 114 Missouri counties, Buchanan County was seventh, at \$52,754. The state of Missouri is at \$57,320. The counties with higher average wages than Buchanan were all in the St. Louis/KC metro areas, outside of Callaway County, which is to the east of Columbia. The counties with higher wages than Buchanan County are St. Louis City (\$70,536), St. Louis County (\$69,239), Jackson County (\$65,252), Platte County (\$56,003), Clay County (\$54,282) and Callaway County (\$52,909). Also note Green County (Springfield), is less than Buchanan at \$50,811.

I also get asked why we have so many manufacturing jobs. A vibrant manufacturing base leads to more research and development, innovation, productivity, exports, and middle-class jobs. Manufacturing helps raise living standards more than any other sector. Manufacturing generates more economic activity than other sectors. For every dollar of domestic manufacturing value added, another \$3.60 of economic activity is generated elsewhere across the local and regional economies. For each manufacturing job, there are 3.4 jobs created in non-manufacturing industries. Think of the need for industrial service-related companies (industrial construction, plumbing, electrical, HVAC, lawn care, etc.)

necessary to support the manufacturing industries in St. Joseph. No other sector comes close to these numbers according to areadevelopment.com.

Good jobs, competitive average wages, and the diverse business clusters we have in St. Joseph like ag tech, animal life sciences, skilled manufacturing, logistics & distribution, agriculture, food processing, and technology & science don't just happen. It comes with the companies investing in St. Joseph because the community strives to create and maintain an environment where


