Economic Development in 2023 is more than incentives to get a company to stay or relocate here. Today, we also have to build a workforce for those companies. We find ourselves working harder than ever on building a better community as outlined in the Imagine St. Joseph 2040 plan, which includes the priorities: invest in people, grow prosperity and create a better place.

COVID taught us people will live where they want and find a job where they want to live. So to continue to grow a thriving workforce, we have to do the work on creating a better place. We know from the community survey in 2021 that 63 percent of the residents surveyed said they thought our

community appearance was below average and it was ranked fourth in order of importance out of all community issues.

We are excited to say we are working as a community to create a better place. Here are a few programs to highlight. Please help spread the word. We can only create a better place if we all work together.

- Urban Homesteading for Homeowners (Local ARPA funds- City)
 Property owners may apply for up to \$25,000 to assist in
 minor repairs to their occupied residential structures.
- Urban Homesteading for Developers (Local ARPA funds- City)
 This is a one-to-one match grant of up to \$50,000 to assist residents in acquiring and improving the exterior of buildings in historic and older residential neighborhoods.
- River Bluff Gateway Grant (State ARPA funds)
 This is a \$2.5 million grant to initiate a targeted, strategic community revitalization project focusing on four areas from the South Side to the River Bluff Bike Trails. The proposal can include anything from structural rehabilitation to green and open space improvements.
- 4. Adopt a Block (Schmidt Foundation Grant and St. Chamber of Commerce)

This volunteer program utilizes businesses and community groups to revitalize a neighborhood. The goal is to remove debris and blight and energize the neighborhood to become active and vibrant.
