



St. Joseph began as a trading post in 1843 and has continued to grow as a commercial center. Historically, the city is the home of the famous Pony Express and of western legends like Jesse James – but today, it gains its national recognition as a center of research

and technology in the Midwest. The bustling westward expansion of the mid-19th century has been succeeded by multi-million dollar business complexes and major interstate highways and airports, keeping transportation and commerce the pulse of the city's life.

Remnants of the past are celebrated with more than 50 National Historic Register listings, mansions, estates and historic commercial structures. Celebration of the past merges with excitement for the future in vibrant downtown revitalization. The spirit of westward expansion that inspired an entrepreneurial attitude in the early 19th century is still evident today. Known for its pivotal role in the Animal Health Corridor, St. Joseph and the surrounding area is buzzing with research, development and production in industries relating to animal health and nutrition.



Population

Although close enough to Kansas City to enjoy its amenities, St. Joseph is a city in its own right. St. Joseph has more than 76,000 residents in its city limits and more than 150,000 in the metro area. Enjoy living in a city that's large enough to meet all your needs, but small enough that you can make a difference.

Transportation

St. Joseph is quite expansive, encompassing 45 square miles. However, daily commutes are light, averaging 16 minutes.

St. Joseph is just 35 minutes away from Kansas City International Airport, which is closer to the airport than many of Kansas City's own suburbs. This means you are just a short half hour direct drive from St. Joseph to KCI, where you can catch a three-hour non-stop flight to the coasts.

The city celebrates the visual arts year-round at the Albrecht-Kemper Museum of Art, and seasonally with events such as Art in the Park and the annual Trails West!® festival. Festivals such as St. Patrick's Mexican Fiesta and the Coleman Hawkins Jazz festival celebrate the city's cultural diversity and continue to draw crowds from the Kansas City metropolitan area to St. Joseph.

Recreation

Enjoy the great outdoors with St. Joseph's unique 26-mile Parkway system. The Parkway links 48 individual parks and sports complexes, including the new city REC Center, with biking and walking trails along the way. The Parkway provides wonderfully hushed passages for walking on a snowy winter day, and comes alive in the summer with the Chamber's Parties on the Parkway series, complete with local music, food and drinks. The city has active bike and running clubs that take advantage of the lovely Parkway system and the beauty of the surrounding countryside. Like to golf? Play on one of the city's four golf courses, including the award-winning St. Joseph Country Club course.



Sports fans here love summer because that is when the

Kansas City Chiefs come to St. Joseph for Summer Training Camp. The three-week camp draws

60,000 attendees, 30,000 of which are visitors to the city who come to enjoy watching professional football training on the campus of Missouri Western State University. St. Joseph was chosen as the summer training site over a number of other cities across the Midwest. The university partnered with the Kansas City Chiefs in constructing the new Indoor Sports Complex, which houses a full-size indoor football field, weight room, offices, locker and meeting rooms. The Training Camp is free to the public and provides concessions and a Kid Zone for smaller children.

The Mustangs play baseball in the city's recently remodeled Phil Welch Stadium. The city's youth soccer association offers a multi-field complex with both fall and spring seasons. Tennis and swim clubs, an aquatic park, several indoor pools and exercise facilities are also highlights of St. Joseph's sports scene. Many families enjoy Griffons' football and basketball games at the campus of MWSU or make a quick drive to Kansas City to see the Chiefs, Royals, Sporting KC or NASCAR.



Shoppers can delight to the charms of downtown boutiques for unique finds at stores like Mod Podge and The Lucky Tiger, while finding major name stores to meet more everyday needs. East Hills Shopping Center, St. Joseph's recently remodeled indoor mall, offers stores like JC Penney, Gordmans, Dillard's, and many more. The Shoppes at North

Village offer an outdoor shopping experience with stores like Old Navy, Bed, Bath and Beyond and Target, just to name a few.

Dining experiences abound, from the culturally-diverse offerings in the downtown (Barbosa's Mexican Restaurant, Boudreaux's Louisiana Seafood and Steaks, The Ground Round) to restaurants with universal name recognition (Buffalo Wild Wings, Cracker Barrel, Cheddar's Casual Cafe) conveniently located in major shopping areas.







Education is integral to St. Joseph living. Families choose from a variety of excellent public, private and parochial schools. The St. Joseph public schools have state and nationally recognized elementary and high schools. St. Joseph believes in the future of its students. Two new elementary schools were added to the district in 2014.

The Missouri Western State University (MWSU) main campus occupies 744 acres in the midst of quiet neighborhoods, offering more than 100 degree programs – including several graduate-level programs, as well as research opportunities in the \$2.5 million Kit Bond Science and Technology Incubator.

St. Joseph's unique location puts the city within an hour's drive of several additional top-quality universities. An easy 45 highway miles north of St. Joseph is the campus of Northwest Missouri State University (NWMSU).
