The President's Perspective

Here we go again!

With the start of the new year begins the next session of the Missouri Legislature. In 2017, there was good progress made on a number of business-related issues, but as is often the case, many important issues got kicked down the road. What we know for sure about 2018 is that it is an election year, which typically does not bode well for the Legislature tackling tough issues.

Following adjournment last year, a special state-wide task force was commissioned to consider transportation funding. The debate over how we fund Missouri's transportation system has been ongoing for a decade with little or no progress. While the task force report and recommendations have yet to be released, you can assume that additional funding will be recommended to maintain and improve our highway system. This is not a big mystery. The question is where will the revenue come from? Most believe a gas tax increase is the most straight forward and reasonable answer, probably something in the .5 to .10 range. Will it happen? Don't bet on it. There will be debate and discussion and perhaps the issue might even make it to the ballot, but I have my doubts legislators, in an election year, will actually vote to increase the gas tax.

To digress, is there a reason we vote for people to serve in the

Legislature and then these same elected officials turn around and ask us to vote on a decision they should make? Hopefully this will not be the case with transportation funding.

Other issues of importance in the upcoming session will be funding for education, sales tax on internet sales, tax reform, funding for job training and maintaining historic tax credits. As is often the case, there are no easy answers, but all of these issues have importance to those of us who live in Missouri.

The St. Joseph Chamber of Commerce will keep you informed during the session and may periodically ask for your assistance in supporting an issue by sending an email or making a call to your senator or representative. The business community working together can make a difference.
