The President's Perspective

Looks Can Be Deceiving

We live in an age of 24/7 news and commentary driven by cable news and social media. While we certainly don't want for news, the competition for attention from this information medium seems to dictate sound bites and images that do not always tell the whole story and often create an image in our minds that can be deceiving. I would offer our federal and state legislative process as a case in point.

Today we note that people's opinion of Congress and the state Legislature are at historically low levels. While frankly there are well-earned reasons for these low opinions of these legislative bodies, it does not tell the whole story. It is these stories of doing the right thing or making progress on important issues that seem to get lost in this era of sound bites and images.

The truth is the Missouri Legislature is currently making progress on a number of issues important to business and our community. As of this writing, there are just a few days left in the session, but members have already passed legislation that will make Missouri more competitive from an economic development standpoint, improved programs to support the development of a quality workforce, improved tort laws and provided much needed funding for transportation improvements.



Our own legislative delegation has done a great job of addressing local priorities, such as the land bank bill. I should note as well that Gov. Parson has provided real executive leadership this year in working with the Legislature to make progress for Missouri.
