A History of Business Success

One of the things I enjoy most about St. Joseph is its history. The historic buildings and homes, the unique architecture, our place in the expansion of the American West and the very real impact St. Jo-seph has had on the history of American business. One could say that the birth of American entrepreneurship happened here! Overstated you say, I offer the following.

Let us begin with the founder of St. Joseph, Joseph Robidoux, $\,$ who came up the Missouri River and landed at what is now the end of Francis Street. In 1843 he founded the Black Snake Hills Trading Company. Joe was involved in many local endeavors and some today might even call him a serial entrepreneur.

How about the Pony Express? Starting in 1860, it demonstrated what future overland transportation could look like. While only lasting one year, it set the standard for point-to-point delivery; think of it as the forerunner of Federal Express Ground. Do not forget about the soda cracker or those pancakes we enjoy at breakfast, both invented by early St. Joseph entrepreneurs. And how about Cherry Mash candy still made in St. Joseph today by the Chase Candy Com-

Speaking of today, how about Hillyard Companies? Its founder N.S. Hillyard, an inventor and entrepreneur, developed the coating used to seal wood basketball courts allowing the use at the time of leather basketballs. The floor coating prevented the basketball from

absorbing the oil used to coat the floors back then. The invention changed the game of basketball forever. The company continues to call St. Joseph home.

Then there were the early days of animal health. A local company Anchor Serum, now known as Boehringer Ingelheim, invented hog cholera serum. The invention revolutionized how hogs were raised and transported, which allowed the modern pork industry of today.
