CHAMBER ANNOUNCES NEW PRESIDENT/CEO TODAY

Redmond holds a bachelor's degree in communications from Missouri Western State University, is a graduate of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Institute of Organization Management and serves in various community leadership roles. She will assume responsibilities on January 3, 2022.
