Imagine St. Joseph 2040 calls for a plan for housing and neighborhood redevelopment strategies. This year the Chamber started a housing task force to look at housing strategies to help meet the needs of housing in St Joseph. The task force includes the City, County, builders, developers, real estate professionals, investors, contractors, non-profits and

As I meet with employers, affordable workforce housing, whether it's renting or buying, has become a need.

The lack of middle-income or "workforce" housing is caused from:

• An aging population leaving the workforce (retiring), but not

- leaving home
   Dilapidated structures taking up potential building space while raising the cost for potential redevelopment
- Lack of homebuyer education, especially in more rural communities

- Inflation and rising interest rates that make it riskier for private contractors while costing buyers more
- Communities feeling like they do not play a role in housing development

Those renting have really felt the hit. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics found that apartment rent has increased 8% in the 12-month period ending in July of 2023, compared to 4.9% for food and 3.5% for new vehicles.
